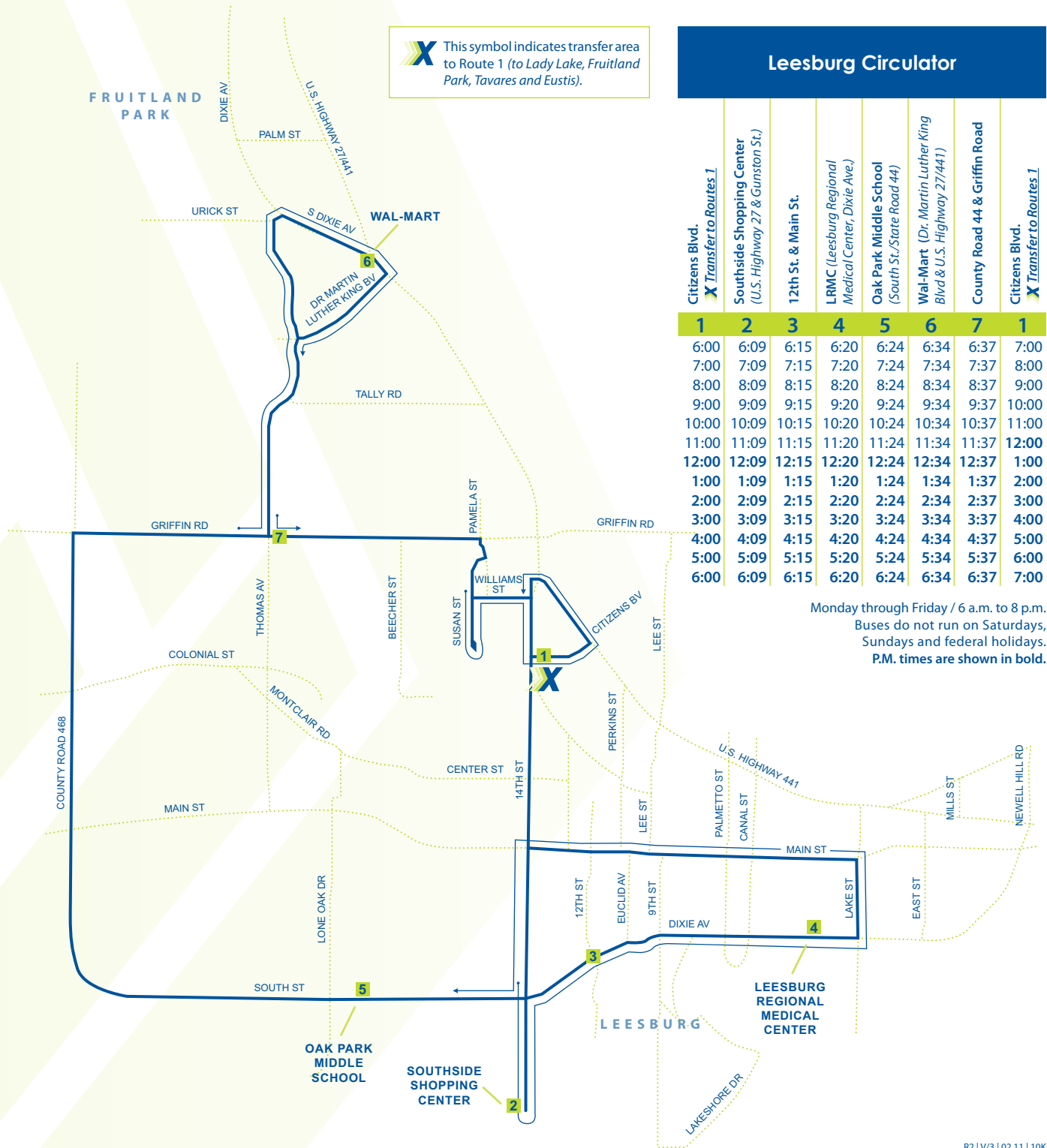

General Information

Lake County bus service, LakeXpress, provides public transportation along the U.S. Highway 441 corridor, including the municipalities of Eustis, Fruitland Park, Lady Lake, Leesburg, Mount Dora, Tavares and Umatilla. Service also connects to LYNX in Zellwood.

LYNX Information — Transferring from LakeXpress Route 4 to LYNX Link 44, or vice versa, is free with a valid transfer pass.

LYNX has a variety of fares that save you time and money. An All-Day Pass (\$4.50) gives you unlimited rides for the day and can only be purchased from the bus operator. Ask the operator for an All-Day pass before putting money in the fare box. LYNX 7-Day Pass (\$16) and 30-Day Pass (\$50) are available at LYNX Central Station, Pass Partner vendors or online at www.golynx.com. If you're making only one stop, the fare is only \$2.00. Riders age 65 and older are eligible for reduced fares and passes. For more information call LYNX at (407) 841-LYNX (5969) or log on to www.golynx.com.

1. Half fares are available for:

- **Seniors** 60 years or older
- **Medicare cardholders**
- Persons who receive **Supplemental Security Income (SSI)**, based on disability, or **Social Security Disability (SSD)** benefits
- **Veterans** with ID card
- **Students** with school ID or proof of enrollment
- **Disabled** (*buses are ADA accessible*)

2. Children under 5 years of age that are accompanied by a fare-paying chaperone are free.

To purchase a bus pass, call **(352) 326-8637** or log on to www.ridelakexpress.com for locations. Bus passes may also be purchased from the libraries in Fruitland Park, Lady Lake, Leesburg and Tavares City Hall.

All purchases are final and non-refundable. The passes cannot be transferred. Copying or other reproduction of LakeXpress passes is prohibited. A valid identification is required for all discount fares. Driver will punch the pass at the time of first use. Date punched reflects expiration date.

Bus Stops

Passengers may board and exit the bus at designated LakeXpress bus-stop locations along the routes. Additionally, passengers may be able to "flag" a bus down anywhere along the route by raising their hand and motioning to the driver as the bus approaches. Passengers may depart the bus by using the pull cord or notifying the driver of their desired drop-off location. The driver will determine the most safe and convenient location to allow passengers to board or exit the bus.

Additional Services

Americans with Disabilities (ADA) Complementary Paratransit Services are available for those who meet the eligibility requirements of the program. For more information contact LakeXpress at (352) 326-8637.

Lake County Connection — This door-to-door service is primarily intended for mobility-impaired, mentally-impaired and senior citizens. The service is provided for individuals who do not have access to any other means of transportation, including public bus service. LYNX — Clermont Express (*Link 204*) to downtown Orlando and a bus route (*Link 55*) in the Four Corners community that extends along U.S. Highway 192. For more information, call (407) 841-LYNX (5969) or log on to www.golynx.com.

Safety Tips

On the Bus

- Use exact fare or a pass. Drivers do not carry change.
- Standees are permitted behind the white line only. When standing, hold on to the handrail or seat handle while the bus is in motion.
- No eating, drinking, smoking or littering are allowed on the buses.
- All passengers must wear shirts and shoes.
- Priority seating in the front section of the buses is reserved for disabled persons and elderly riders. Flip-type seats located near the wheelchair boarding entrance are for people using wheelchairs.
- Please talk quietly in your seats; no running or playing on the buses.
- No soliciting, committing a nuisance, fighting or vandalism.
- While on the bus, it is prohibited to play radios or other sound devices without earphones.
- No weapons or firearms are allowed on County vehicles or property.
- Service animals are allowed for riders with disabilities. There is no added fare.
- Use cellular phones in a quiet and courteous manner.
